ViVa Doctors are needed from August 2014 onwards. This is only 15 months from now, but you still have time to do the planning and training necessary to undertake what could be the best experience of your professional and personal family life. If you have considered working in a developing country but doubted your capabilities, you can take heart in the fact that more than 30 doctors with the same doubts have successfully served on Tanna and never regretted it. The ViVa organization will help train, guide, and support you. The people of Tanna and the hospital staff will show their appreciation for your efforts. Your family will feel welcome, and after 6 months, they may not want to leave!

ViVa prefers doctors from the South Island because meeting attendance is important to the sustainability of our Project. However, as the deadline approaches (within 6 months), other Canadian applicants will be welcome to apply.

Tanna update

In late January, Dr. Mike Pilgrim and his wife Lorna Way, left their frozen, snow-bound home in Dawson Creek, BC and arrived on the tropical shores of Tanna. At the last minute, they offered to fill in the empty slot from February to July 2013. Mike and Lorna attended an intensive 1-day orientation session in Victoria then plunged into the ni-Van culture and health scene. They have been doing an amazing job. They are raising chickens, enjoying the harvest from the garden planted by Dr. Don and Rebecca Fockler, and getting right into Tanna life.

Before handing over to Mike and Lorna, Don and Rebecca made major improvements to Ol Frens Guesthouse and got permission for the ViVa doctor to take over its financial management. This should keep it in good shape for visiting health workers. It will be rented for a year at 20,000 Vatu per month to an AusAid-sponsored pharmacist.
