Fundraising is always ongoing due to the high costs of maintaining the Doctor's truck and house in Vanuatu. Michael recently reported that the house roof needs to be replaced and some new floor covering will be needed for the peeling linoleum tiles. These will be expensive undertakings.

New Oxygen Plants to be installed in Vila and Santo

Through AusAid funding, oxygen-generating machines will be installed at Vila Central Hospital in Port Vila and Northern District Hospital on the island of Espiritu Santo. These would be great assets to the hospitals because it would remove the need to buy oxygen from the private gas suppliers. The hospitals would be able to use in-wall piped oxygen instead of the heavy and hazardous oxygen tanks. Unfortunately, Tanna's Lenakel Hospital is not included in the plan.

Lenakel Hospital is usually reliant on the expensive purchase of oxygen tanks shipped from Port Vila. Due to shortages of hospital funds or delays in shipping, too many ViVa doctors have had the horrible experience of watching infants and children die on Tanna simply because there was no oxygen to help them through their illnesses.

We have been lucky in the last six years to have the use of a small oxygen generator unit on Tanna. This unit was donated by AusAid and Rotary International (Australia). ViVa has taken a special interest in servicing and maintaining this machine, spending over \$7000 dollars on it. Despite much care and attention in an effort to protect the machine from the heat, humidity, and volcanic ash, the machine will not last very long.

This is another project with which ViVa will stay closely involved. Hopefully after the new oxygen plants are installed in Port Vila, the oxygen for shipping will be less expensive and in more plentiful supply for Lenakel Hospital
